Abstract

This report was developed and published as a documentary legacy and reference material on the implementation details of the youth and women engagement and interventions in economic and entrepreneurial activities, under the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) funded and International Institute of Tropical Agriculture (IITA) implemented Feed the Future Nigeria Integrated Agriculture Activity (NIAA), in northeast Nigeria. The publication is an abridged technical report of implementation activities on youth and women entrepreneurship development in the agricultural value

Introduction

The Feed the Future Nigeria Integrated Agriculture Activity (also referred to as the Activity) commenced development intervention activities on 19th July, 2019 as part of USAID's contributions to the economic recovery in Northeast Nigeria in the wake of the devastation caused by the intractable conflict in the region. The Activity

publication is meant to preserve the gains of the Activity's implementation approach and models, and also serve as a useful guide to future implementing partners (IPs), small-scale entrepreneurs, youth and gender enthusiasts, development actors, enterprise development service providers, students and researchers on the subject matter.

engaged vulnerable populations disenfranchised by the Boko Haram insurgency and re-oriented participants in basic farming activities with IITA promoted climate smart agricultural technologies, good agronomic practices (GAP), nutrition sensitive and specific interventions, markets and entrepreneurship. In the same region, while many intervention agencies chose to focus on short-term humanitarian support to address immediate livelihood needs of the population, USAID Nigeria sought to complement the myriad short-term support with a longer-term vision of economic growth encapsulated in the Feed the Future Nigeria Integrated Agriculture Activity. The Activity issued under the US Government's Global Food Security Act aims to advance the objectives of inclusive and sustainable agriculture-led economic growth, strengthened resilience among people and systems, and a well-nourished population, especially among women and children in targeted locations of Adamawa, Borno, Gombe, and Yobe States.

The Activity works in collaboration with public and private sector partners to achieve its objectives, which include, the facilitation of improved Agro-input and extension advisory services to serve vulnerable populations, strengthening the institutions that form the market system and the networks that serve smallholder farmers, including improved nutrition for the households disenfranchised by conflict, and the facilitation of youth and women engagements in economic and entrepreneurial activities that will lead to job opportunities, increased household income, and improved resilience.

The context

Abinitio, the northeastern part of Nigeria known for its massive production of crops and livestock, which contributes greatly to the country's economy, has been seriously affected by Boko Haram (BH) and the Islamic State in West Africa Province (ISWAP) insurgency. Food security, nutrition, and livelihoods have been negatively affected by the multifaceted conflicts in the region. Consequently, women, men, boys and girls have been abducted, forcefully conscripted, raped, and forcibly married in areas affected by the insurgency (Osita, Njoku and Chikere, 2015). Displaced populations and host communities are confronted with severe food and nutrition insecurity, resulting from distorted agricultural production activities, dysfunctional markets, and loss of livelihood assets. The insurgency has compelled farmers to abandon their farmlands, fishing, as well as livestock trades. The vulnerable groups, particularly women and children bear the brunt of the social and economic malaise.

Thus, economic opportunities for youth and women becomes a core intervention of the Integrated Agriculture Activity. The Activity strive to identify opportunities for youth and women in the agribusiness and non-farm micro enterprise clusters. The approach is to deliberately leverage the energy and entrepreneurial abilities of women and youth, and strategically address the constraints limiting their participation in the market. The Activity facilitates training, mentorship, technical advisory services, improved technology, private sector involvement, and the right institutional support to productively engage the women

and youth population of Adamawa, Borno, Gombe, and Yobe States of northeast Nigeria. This is essentially to reduce the rate of unemployment in the region and deter recruitment of idle youth by the insurgents.

Justification

According to the Nigerian National Youth Policy (2009), the youth population could be described as *“one of the greatest assets that any nation can have. Not only are they legitimately regarded as the future leaders, they are potentially and actually the greatest investment for a country’s development”*. The revised National youth policy (2019) established that the youth shall comprise of all young males and females aged 15 – 29 years, who are citizens of the Federal Republic of Nigeria. This sector of the population represents the most active, the most volatile, and yet the most vulnerable segment of the nation’s population. The policy further elicits the fact that most communities in Nigeria are agrarian, very well so in Adamawa, Borno, Gombe, and Yobe States, in consonance with the Integrated Agriculture Activity objectives, and that many young people, and indeed women, who choose to work in this sector unfortunately lack the necessary support to improve their productive capacity. *“Very often they do not have access to land, credit as well as extension services”*. These gaps accordingly constitute the focus of the youth and women engagement and interventions under the Integrated Agriculture Activity.

Expected outcomes

1. More youth and women are gainfully employed in farm and non-farm activities, including machinery operation and repair, processing, and other opportunities.
2. Stronger links between women and youth and financial institutions, thereby facilitating the intensification and diversification of economic activities.
3. Increase in economic and entrepreneurial skills of participating women and youth.

Expected outputs

1. At least 5000 youth and women participants have adequate training in Agribusiness and Entrepreneurial skills.
2. At least 5000 women and youth have an expanded range of income generating opportunities linked to target value chains (labour-saving mechanization, processing, aggregation, and service sector).
3. At least 500 youth and women are trained in farm machinery operations.
4. At least 200 youth and women are trained in farm machinery repairs and maintenance skills.
5. At least 2500 youth and women have increased their capacity to engage with financial institution to access financial services for intensification and diversification of economic activities.

Methodology

Targeting and mobilization strategy

The inclusive market economy and group mobilization approach was adopted, with standard targets and market actors who are women and youth, and who are theoretically classified as,

- a. Resource poor consumers
- b. Small entrepreneurs
- c. Petty traders
- d. Smallholder producers
- e. School leavers
- f. Graduates of tertiary educational institutions.

The inclusive market economy and group mobilization approach was adopted specifically

- i. To increase the depth of participation to the community/ward level, and particularly reach the usually marginalised sectors – youth and women – for inclusive agribusiness and non – farm enterprise development activities in the market domain, thereby deliberately seeking to improve the livelihood of the economically viable but resource poor population.
- ii. To, through measured interventions act as grassroots catalyst for the rural economy.
- iii. To identify the categories of the resource poor (poorest of the poor, chronically poor, economically viable poor, and the non – poor) and focus the appropriate targets with the appropriate interventions.
- iv. To identify and facilitate the growth and development of the economically viable poor through market driven interventions.
- v. To strive to increase the percentage of female participants in USG-assisted programs designed to increase access to productive economic resources (GNDR-2), and the
- vi. Percentage of participants in USG-assisted programs designed to increase access to productive economic resources who are youths (YOUTH-3).

Group mobilization and intervention specific action steps

- a. Identification and engagement of LGA stakeholders.
- b. Identification and sorting of stakeholder groups (registered youth and women associations) at community/ward levels.
- c. Profiling and selection of relevant youth and women groups.
- d. Supplementary/targeted registration to specifically capture selected youth and women households.
- e. Rapid needs assessment for selected youth and women groups to support the design of relevant intervention activities.

- f. Development and deployment of intervention strategies taking cognisance of Activity objectives and participants' livelihood aspirations.

Gender Equality, Empowerment of Women and Social Inclusion (GEESI) (ToT and Step down) - Gender roles and responsibilities, gender equity, and gender stereotypes. Sensitization training for staff, field structures, partners and community gatekeepers.

Gender – based violence (GBV) (ToT and Step down) - types, causes, consequences, and options for mitigation.

COVID 19 awareness – Signs and symptoms, protection against the spread, quality hygiene on living and working with the virus.

Model Specification and Conceptual framework

Youth and women entrepreneurship implementation strategy

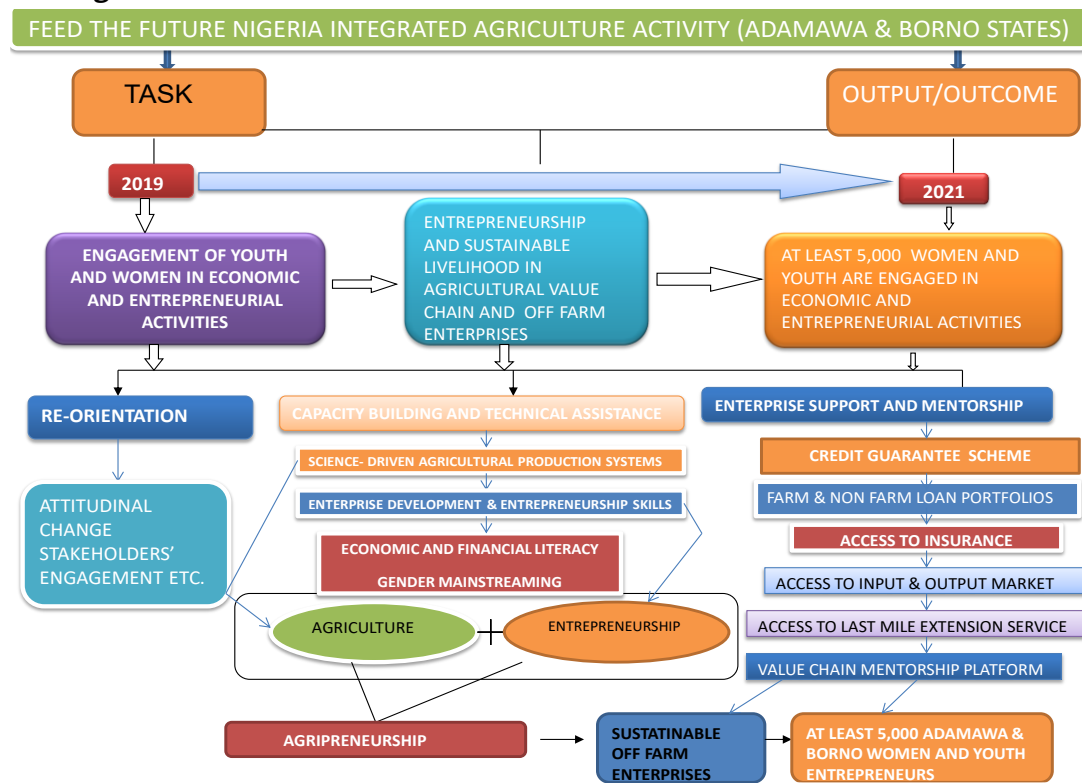


Figure 1: FTF Nigeria IAA youth and women entrepreneurship implementation model.

The employed youth and women development model (figure 1) is also christened “Enterprise Development Tripod Sustainability Model [ED-TSM]”. The schematic process is to facilitate the twin goal of giving skills in agriculture – led economic growth and deepening the resilience of the traumatized youth, women and vulnerable population of intervention States, thereby supporting their journey toward self-reliance (J2SR) within the prism of the Integrated Agriculture Activity Market systems approach. This model operates under the understanding that enterprise development through agriculture, agribusiness, agricultural value chain, and off – farm livelihood activities present the best opportunity for engaging young people and women towards job creation, self-employment, self – reliance, and sustainable livelihoods. It is indeed an approach that offers the young population an immediate source of livelihood (with adequate support, funding and mentorship), as against the lure of insurgency which hitherto seems lucrative to their idle hands and mind; and through which a lot of damage has been done to the life and livelihoods of the people of northeast Nigeria.

Tripod Sustainability Principle

Standing on three legs (re-orientation, capacity building, and enterprise support/mentorship) for stability and sustainability, the model is reminiscent of the myth and stability surrounding the African cooking pot on a triangular fire stand.

Re-orientation Stand (Foundation phase): This phase commences with Stakeholders’ identification and engagement, and dovetails into mind-set changing activities and attitudinal change among stakeholders and participants. It includes targeting of participants, screening and registration of participants, and capacity and gender gaps assessment.

Capacity building and technical support phase: Activities in this phase include; training, business planning and activation, economic and financial literacy, cooperatives

management, statutory business registration, and internship. Gender mainstreaming including incorporation of mechanisms to ensure gender equality, women empowerment, social inclusion, balanced representation and participation in activities, and decision-making processes, collection and analysis of sex-disaggregated data.

Enterprise support and Mentorship phase: This phase activates business activities, credit guarantee scheme (where operational) and access to finance, access to input and output markets, access to last-mile extension services, mentorship and business development services. Trickle effects across communities/borders, and sustainable exit strategies.

FTF Nigeria IAA YOUTH & WOMEN ENTREPRENEURSHIP IMPLEMENTATION MODEL

Gender strategy and implementation model

According to WHO (2017), and Sida (2015) “as development programmes intervene in conflict zones, it will be necessary to adopt a shift in focus, from looking at just women in development to focusing on gender and development, which goes beyond the mere inclusion of women in program design and implementation to looking at power relations between women and men, and how those relations can impede or facilitate development outcomes”

In consequence, many development programs have failed to achieve sustainable impacts because of a failure to adequately integrate gender issues into their programming and intervention activities. Gender equality is currently recognized as an important goal in itself as well as being critical to achieving other development objectives, such as reducing hunger and poverty. This assertion is incontrovertible worldwide, particularly sub-Saharan Africa, where women play very important roles in agriculture. Gender-sensitive policies and programming are central to effectively advancing the Malabo Declaration's agricultural transformation agenda.

Notwithstanding, the crux of the matter and the critical questions remains:

- What is the status or progress towards achieving gender equality?
- What are the main challenges?
- What are the effective means of surmounting those challenges? and
- How can gender equality and women empowerment be effectively mainstreamed in development interventions?

Putting these perspectives in focus, effective women participation and gender mainstreaming under the Integrated Agriculture Activity was structured to ensure:

- ✓ Identification and mobilization of women/gender/youth groups and associations for strategic grassroots participation.
- ✓ Training on gender mainstreaming is periodically organized for Activity staff, field structures, partners, and stakeholders.
- ✓ Designed activities meet the specific needs of women, men, boys, girls and vulnerable groups in relation to Activity objectives.
- ✓ Incorporation of mechanisms to ensure gender balanced representation and participation in activities, and decision-making processes (targeting at least 40 percent of whichever sex is underrepresented).
- ✓ Collection and analysis of sex-disaggregated data.
- ✓ Consideration of lessons learned from previous projects with gender dimensions.

Consequently, the Integrated Agriculture Activity's Gender integration and women empowerment strategy is built around the USAID promoted Women Empowerment in Agriculture Index (WEAI) approach with five implementation domains.

Women Empowerment in Agriculture Index (WEAI) - five domains of empowerment (5de) approach

Inclusive development requires that women and men have equal opportunities to contribute and share accrued benefits from development interventions and activities. Unfortunately, several studies have revealed gender inequalities in project participation and opportunities which has stalled many efforts toward achieving equitable and

sustainable development. Thus, the Activity's Gender analysis desk review, agrees that communities in the intervention areas, and indeed generally in northern Nigeria, are faced with numerous socioeconomic constraints which are linked to gender issues.

There exists unequal access to production resources and gender - skewed power relations and perceptions that hinders the effectiveness of development intervention in the region. This phenomenon (gender inequality) is clearly attributable to cultural and religious norms and socio-economic conditions of the population. Therefore, to foster inclusive and gender sensitive development, there is the need to address gender issues in programming, not as a standalone activity, but integrated into the entire Activity interventions.

Women Empowerment in Agriculture Index (WEAI) implementation guide in the context of Feed the Future Nigeria Integrated Agriculture Activity

Domain 1: Access to production knowledge and technologies

- a. Facilitation of access to production training, climate – smart agricultural technologies, and enterprise development guides and flyers.
- b. Technical backstopping on production and enterprise development.
- c. Last mile extension services through agents and mentors.

Domain 2: Access to production resources

- a. Facilitation of cluster formations that enhances access to, ownership, and control of farmlands.
- b. Facilitation of sustainable linkage to last mile/community-based Agro-input dealers.
- c. Facilitate economic and financial literacy training in partnership with reliable financial institutions (FIs), Business Development Service Providers (BDSPs), and other sectoral actors.
- d. Facilitation of access to finance/inputs through partnerships on smart enterprise support schemes such as starter packs, and credit guarantee scheme that will enhance steady access to resources from reputable financial institutions (Fis).
- e. Facilitation of the introduction of inclusive financial products by reputable micro financial institutions (MFIs).
- f. Facilitation of inclusive access to finance models through reputable private sector actors.
- g. Facilitation of savings and revolving loans scheme amongst established clusters and strengthen their operations through training.

Domain 3: Control over income and expenditure

- a. Facilitation of the connection of female farmers to stable markets and/or out grower contract schemes.

- b. Facilitation of the consensual use of secure deposit mechanisms by women.

Domain 4: Group participation and leadership

- a. Specific targeting and mobilization of women led groups/associations

Domain 5: Time allocation

- b. Intensification of gender equality and inclusive development trainings and elimination of gender stereotypes.

Results and Sample Success Stories

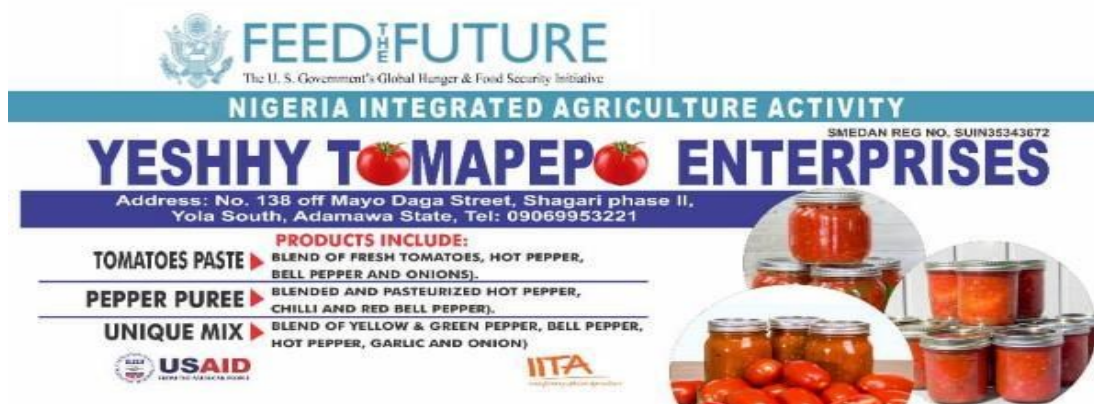
In spite of the intractable insurgency in the northeast, and COVID-19 pandemic that triggered massive disruption of economic and entrepreneurial activities, with disproportionate impacts on youth and women employment and enterprise activities; the USAID Feed the Future Nigeria Integrated Agriculture Activity between inception in 2019 and 2022, working with about two hundred youth and women associations/cooperative groups; twenty – four community development officers (CDOs), as key collaborators at the local government level; 13- private, 2-non-profit and 6-government sector partners; has trained a total of six thousand, two hundred and forty – one (6,241) youth and women participants in Adamawa and Borno States. The training activities featured agricultural production and enterprise activities in the priority crops (maize, rice, sorghum, millet, groundnut, soybean, and cowpea) and livestock (poultry, large and small ruminants, piggery, and fish farming) value chains; including non – farm enterprises, farm machine operations, farm machinery repairs, farm equipment fabrication, and vocational skills (tailoring, knitting, barbing, machine repairs, shoe making, GSM phone repairs, screen printing, soap making, and tyre vulcanization).

The trainings were specifically designed to facilitate production and vocational skills acquisition, business skills acquisition/entrepreneurship, income generation, job creation and improved livelihoods, across the twelve Local Government Areas of intervention in Adamawa and Borno States, northeast, Nigeria. Accordingly, over six thousand direct job opportunities were created through production and enterprise skills in the agricultural value chain and non – farm enterprise activities. This has directly contributed to achieving the critical target and indicators of:

- a. Improved skills of participating youth and women to operate and own agric. and off farm businesses.
- b. Number of enterprises established along priority crops and livestock value chains by women and youth with support from USG, and
- c. At least 5,000 women and youth have an expanded range of income generating opportunities linked to target value chains, and are most importantly creating downstream job opportunities for other young men and women in Adamawa and Borno States, northeast Nigeria.

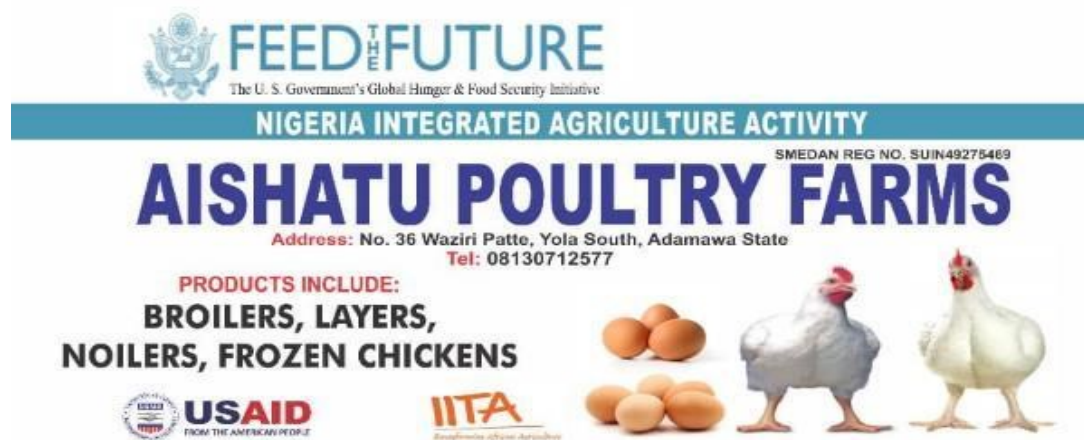
The interventions are systematically leading to the much-expected outcome of “More youth and women are gainfully employed in farm and non-farm activities, and other opportunities”. It is also pertinent to report that the trained participants commenced active enterprise activities with the registration of over two thousand business names with the Small and Medium Scale Enterprises Development Agency of Nigeria (SMEDAN) to obtain the SMEDAN Unique Identification Number (SUIN), and sixty-five with the Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC) for the certificate of registration of business name (CRBN). Please see appendices 1 - 6 for the number of enterprises established along priority crops and livestock value chains by women and youth with support from USG, youth and women enterprise training summary (2019 – 2022), summary of enterprise sectoral trainings (2019 - 2022), gender participation analysis, list of registered micro enterprises with SMEDAN, and number of formal and informal research and private sector partnerships formed.

SPECIAL ENTERPRISE FEATURE – TOMAPEPO PRODUCTION AND WOMEN EMPOWERMENT



Yeshi Simon, CEO Yeshhy Tomapepo Enterprises, is a 27yrs old youth female entrepreneur, graduate of political science, residing at Shagari phase II, Yola South local government area, Adamawa State. She commenced a small-scale tomato processing (Tomapepo) business in April 2021 after attending the Agro processing enterprise training

organised by the Feed the Future Nigeria Integrated Agriculture Activity in March 2021. The enterprise is a start-up business on the processing of tomato, pepper and onions into healthy puree and paste without preservatives. Through the business development partnership of the Activity with the Technology Incubation Centre (TIC) Yola, an arm of the Federal Ministry of Science, Innovation and Technology (FMSIT), Yeshe was admitted for internship and currently working with the team of experts toward standardization of the Tomapepo product. Tomapepo is simply a blend of tomatoes, pepper and onion (TOMA=Tomatoes, PEP=Pepper, O=Onions). The blend is processed and preserved in a heat resistant bottle through pasteurization. The product development as an enterprise activity for participants, particularly women, is informed by its combined nutritive value, which is also underscored by the focus of Integrated Agriculture. Creation of direct and downstream job opportunities for women and youth to counteract the lure of recruitment for insurgency, and opportunity to prolong the shelf life of tomatoes by improving the processing, storage and packaging methods, thereby making the product available year – round (on and off-season), are added advantages.



Aisha Jalaludeen, a youth female participant, the sole proprietor Aishatu poultry farms is one of the remarkable impact stories of the Feed the Future intervention under the Nigeria Integrated Agriculture Activity. A 2013 diploma graduate in Islamic Studies from the Adamawa State Polytechnic, she possessed no basic skills or understanding of poultry farming. A mother of two kids who lives with her husband, a tailor, in a one-bedroom apartment in Yola South, Adamawa State. Aishat hawked sachet water on the streets of Yola to be able to fend for herself and support her young family of four. Apart from the attendant risk of the water-hawking trade, she was exposed to further dangers on the street like road traffic accident and persistent fatigue. Her daily take – home from this highly demanding venture was about ₦100 profit per day. For a young woman who has a daughter, Rukayat, who in turn had to sometimes skip school because of paucity of funds for upkeep; the chance exposure to IAA training in June 2020 was her “saving grace”.

According to Aisha, *“I was doing the sachet water hawking because there was nothing else to do. Many times, I encountered losses and serious harassment doing the business,”* she said in an interview.

Aisha’s turnaround came when she was identified by the IAA team, working in partnership with the Yola South Local Government Social Welfare Unit, during initial targeting of prospective youth and women entrepreneurs in the LGA. She was subsequently enrolled in the June 2020 batch of the poultry production and enterprise training which was conducted at the Adamawa Agricultural Development and Investment Limited (AADIL), Farming Skill Acquisition Centre (FSAC), Yola. The training intervention centred on basic poultry rearing terminologies, chicks brooding, feeding, and medication for poultry stocks. Fast forward, Aisha has successfully managed the fifteenth broiler production cycle, in her sure step towards self-sustenance and economic resilience. In the first six weeks of her graduation, Aisha made a gross income of ₦80,000 from her poultry products, from which she made a net profit of ₦20,000. Today, Aisha’s marriage is strengthened with her ownership of a poultry pen that accommodates over 100 chickens per cycle. From August 2020 when she commenced active poultry rearing, she had made a consistent profit of about ₦35,000 every month, providing support to her family and being able to afford the payment of her daughter’s school fees, as well as easily helping with her aged parent’s medication. Aisha Jalaludeen is one of the scores of youth, women and men in the Northeast whose lives have been transformed by the Feed the Future interventions.

In her own words, "The poultry business through USAID intervention has impacted my life positively in a lot of areas. Before now, I am unable to solve my domestic needs, but now, I solve most domestic issues myself—issues like health, child school fees, etc. If I need money, I sell some of my chickens and get money to solve it. I do not wait or ask loan from anybody again."



Challenges

As part of efforts to ensure that youth and women are gainfully employed in farm and non-farm activities, promote income generation, reduce unemployment, and prevent the recruitment of idle youth by the insurgents in the northeast region; the Integrated Agriculture Activity has trained over six thousand youth and women in several agricultural and non – farm enterprise skills that are market ready. However, the young entrepreneurs after training are faced with the problem of accessibility and affordability of financial resources for enterprise development. There is a reluctance of financial institutions (FIs) to finance business startups, for obvious reasons, thereby presenting a major setback for business activities.

Young people do not have the credit history and collaterals required by financial institutions to unlock access to finance for start-ups. The resource poor participants cannot proceed to start a business essentially due to high rural poverty. A more compelling fact is the sudden entry of the COVID – 19 pandemics, which further impoverished the people and almost reversing the gains of development and poverty reduction interventions. COVID-19 pandemic triggered massive disruption of economic and entrepreneurial activities with disproportionate impacts on youth and women employment and business opportunities. The intractable insecurity in the region calls for concern and concerted actions to engender a peaceful environment for enterprise activities.

Opportunities (What worked well)

1. Introduction of innovative technologies (climate smart agriculture, entrepreneurship skills, financial literacy, business planning skills, and institutional mentorship) in the agricultural value chain.
2. Catalysing the rural economy through training interventions in the priority crops and livestock value chain, and non – farm enterprises, and entrepreneurship.
3. Creation of direct and downstream job opportunities through enterprise development in the agricultural value chain, vocational skills and non-farm enterprises.
4. Collaboration with relevant local government units in identifying target participants.

Exit Strategy and Sustainability Plan (What are we going to leave behind?)

As an Activity funded by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) under the Feed the Future Nigeria, and in consonance with the several levels of intervention activities implemented from inception in 2019, progressing steadily to close out by December 2024; we will be leaving behind, amongst others:

1. Over two thousand registered women and youth owned micro enterprises that are active and relevant to inclusive food system transformation as envisaged by the donor.
2. Over six thousand youth and women participants that are gainfully employed in farm and non-farm activities, and have increased income generation and improved livelihood.
3. Over six thousand women and youth participants with improved resilience in their journey towards self-reliance (J2SR).
4. A financially literate and economically active youth and women population in our coverage areas.
5. A Gender sensitive, Gender aware and socially inclusive population in the host communities.

6. A multi-sectoral enterprise mentorship platform for sustainability (TIC, SMEDAN, AADIL, CLN, LFN, Sterling Bank, etc.)

Conclusion and policy recommendations

The key message at this stage, is that despite the difficult terrain of northeastern Nigeria due to intractable insurgency, the socioeconomic stressors of a region in conflict, and routine challenges of business neophytes (young entrepreneurs); through funding from United States Agency for International Development (USAID), and the goodwill of the American People, under the Feed the Future Nigeria Integrated Agriculture Activity; we can conveniently assert that there is a steady progress in the culture of entrepreneurship among women and youth, as a veritable means to sustainable livelihood, particularly in the agricultural value chain.

Lessons learned and recommendations

1. Banks and other financial institutions are not, and will not, be taking risks for MSMEs, particularly micro enterprise startups. Perhaps development actors may have to develop a field friendly model that is workable, scalable and sustainable. An inclusive micro enterprise financing model that will practically work for the poor is urgently required for meaningful development.
2. Fine – tuning the DCA Guarantees with Financial Institutions on MSME financing may have to be considered by USAID to achieve the desired result.
3. Development of an innovative multi - sectoral partnership on “Blended Finance Model” has become imperative. This may help to address the two significant financing challenges of accessibility and affordability.
4. A better coordination and collaboration between humanitarian and development actors on the field is strongly recommended. The market system approach is excellent for sustainability but presents a dilemma on the field where humanitarian (with handouts) and development activities are going on simultaneously in the same region and among the same population. This result in a lot of confusion, distortion and apathy among the target population to the disadvantage of development practitioners.
